ENG 08.04 Mirror Mirror Representing Teenagers in Young Adult Fiction: Imaginative Respo to a Novel	ENG 08.05 Your Story, My Story, Our Story Reading and Viewing Stories about Australia		
This unit is an extended study of a young adult fiction novel. Studen will have their novel to read over the holidays, if they wish. During the first semester, we will have explored the concept of representations, and how authors can make choices to position readers to see and understand people, places, issues and events in desired ways. In this unit students will read, view and discuss the representations issues important to young people and how they are constructed in t novel. Students will look at particular ways we read to make meanin across texts, the choices used to construct characters and issues, an how points of view are represented.	We all have stories about our sense of identity, our values and beliefs and the way we see our world. Language can help us to express and communicate this sense of self and connectedness. In this unit, students will listen to, read and interpret a variety of literary texts about Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples' histories and cultures. They will read aloud a text or excerpts selected from texts that influence emotions and opinions on matters raised in the text/s. Students will explain how the text/s use/s language in an emotive way, drawing on evidence selected from the text/s.
