In this unit, students will study medieval Europe, with a particular focus on the emergence and development of the feudal and manorial systems, and the nature of crime and punishment during this time. Focus questions:  What was the significance of the feudal system in medieval Europe? This unit examines the processes that shape individual landforms, the values and meanings placed on landforms and landscapes by people, hazards, and management of landscapes. Students will develop an understanding of the concept	Students will investigate the changing human geography of countries, as revealed by shifts in population distribution. Students will explore the process of urbanisation to show how this process changes the economies and societies of low and middle-income countries.  Focus questions:  How do environmental and human processes affect the characteristics of places and environments?  What are the consequences of changes to places and environments and how can these changes be managed?
